He is the author of the bestselling book *Finnish Lessons 2.0: What can the world learn from educational change in Finland*. He is also a former Director General of Centre for International Mobility and Cooperation at the Finland's Ministry of Education and Culture in Helsinki, and a visiting Professor of Practice at Harvard University's Graduate School of Education in Cambridge, MA, USA. He is currently a visiting scholar at Arizona State University. His presentation at the CPCO Conference will explore the relationship between leadership, equity, student achievement and well-being — respective of Ontario's very diverse populations and conditions.
